

Three years of full-time pre-chiropractic studies
 Four years of full-time study at CMCC

Admission Requirements:

- Admission to the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College requires at least three years (90 credits) of Arts and Science courses.
- Interview

There are no course requirements for admissions although for those who are yet to begin their undergraduate studies are encouraged to study kinesiology, biology, psychology, anatomy and organic chemistry, as well as humanities and/or social sciences.

- There is only one entry point into the program each year (September).
- Students can apply after completing 90 credits providing that academic requirements are completed no later than May 31 of the year of registration for first year courses.
- Although CMCC does not have any required prerequisite courses, applicants should check with the licensing body of the area in which they intend to practice to confirm whether the licensing body has any prerequisites in order to practice.

Admission Statistics

- The minimum academic requirement for admission **consideration** is a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 2.50 from at least three full years (90 credits) of undergraduate study in Canada at an accredited university.
- Interviews are granted if the applicant meets the required undergraduate CGPA of a 2.50 on a 4.00 scale. (For details on how to prepare for the interview, visit their website)
- Over 500 applicants for the 192 spaces available each year. Average entry GPA: 3.00.
